Abstract:

A vast amount of gas hydrate resources are evaluated to exist in offshore Japan. Japanese government is anticipating gas hydrate as one of future energy resources and organized MH21 research consortium to develop these untapped resources. Many researches and developments of technologies are being conducted in this consortium towards economical production and recovery of gas hydrate.

As a part of these researches, MH21 simulator has been developed to evaluate gas productivity from methane hydrate reservoirs. Outline of this simulator is to be explained. It is also to be discussed which reservoir properties are considered to be very important from the view point of gas production from the gas hydrate reservoirs.
